

## Data Center Archival

IUE Guest Observer (GO) data will be delivered to the data center in monthly intervals, having been cataloged by image sequence number with corresponding archival tape ID and file number. Associated with the data will be a release date six months from the date of delivery of data to the GO. On the release date, data may be issued by the data center to requestors. Shared data may be released earlier upon authorization of the original investigator. A reference catalog of past observations will be made available by the data center to the GO, encouraging the GO to utilize previous data and thereby allowing the GO to observe other objects.

A film file copy will be kept at the IUE Observatory as well.

Reminders of rules for use of government-owned magnetic tapes:

Magnetic tapes are provided the GO on a long term temporary loan basis. These tapes, containing the GO's processed images, are government owned and must be returned to GSFC after a reasonable amount of time.

## COORDINATED OBSERVING PROGRAM WITH THE IUE

Opportunities for conducting coordinated observing programs with the IUE and HEAO-1 are available.

Such a program may take the form of pooling together the IUE telescope time among the U. S. and European users or the form of simultaneous observations with other satellites and ground-based telescopes.

An example of the former can be seen in the report prepared by Dr. R. J. Davis.

An example of the latter is the simultaneous observations of the BL Lac object MK501 with the IUE, HEAO-1, 200-inch telescope (Hale Observatories), 300-ft radio telescope (Greenbank) and 46-meter radio telescope (Algonquin). This program is currently in progress and some positive results are already indicated. Further information on this campaign will be included in the next Newsletter.
